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Town of Arcadia Minutes of Regular Board Meeting September 24 at 7 p.m.

The September 24, 2012 board meeting was called to order by Chairman Ronald Tuschner at 7:00 p.m. Open meeting certifications were met. Roll call was taken. All Board members were present: Chairman Ronald Tuschner and Supervisors Michael Wineski and Ivan Pronschinske. Also present were the attached list of residents.

A motion was made by I. Pronschinske and seconded by M. Wineski to adopt the agenda as prepared. The motion was carried with a voice vote.

A motion was made by M. Wineski and seconded by I. Pronschinske to approve the September 10, 2012 meeting minutes. The motion was carried with a voice vote.

At 7:04 p.m. R. Tuschner opened the floor to public comments for other topics that were not listed on the September 24, 2012 agenda. R. Tuschner made the first call for requests for comments. Connor Misch presented an update of his Eagle Scout project to the Board. Following the update, Jeff Bawek mentioned that he had questions regarding the KAW Valley sand mine as well as progress to Soppa Road. It was agreed that comments would be held until the subjects were covered later in the meeting. Paul Winey posed a question regarding semi-annual mine meetings. The Board commented that meetings have not been held yet, but will determine how they are going to proceed. R. Tuschner made a second call and third call for requests for comments. At 7:11 p.m. R. Tuschner closed the floor to public comments.

Alpine Sand Mine road agreement

Regarding Soppa Road, the curb has been installed; still needs to be widened and blacktopped. There is still a concern about dust. Jeff Bawek voiced a concern that in the event of a mine going bankrupt they would still be liable to return road to meet mandatory specifications. The Board will need to continue to establish road use agreements for each mine. Comment also was made by P. Winey regarding finalization of sand mine criteria. Final decisions need to be posted.

KGB lane bid

The current temporary bypass cannot be retained during winter. A motion was made by M. Wineski to accept the \$66K bid and move forward with the project. The motion was seconded by I. Pronschinske, and carried by a voice vote.

Thompson Valley Road project

R. Tuschner received bid from Ayres and Associates for their assistance in compiling DNR forms for the Thompson Valley Road project. A motion was made by M. Wineski and seconded by I. Pronschinske to accept the \$2900 bid and move forward with the project. The motion carried with a voice vote.

Lundsford's request regarding set-back

Bill Lundsford approached the Board, requesting a set-back so a garage can be built on his property. If Board approved, the next step would be for Lundsford to speak to the Trempealeau County Land Management department. R. Tuschner made a motion to send a letter to the County in agreement of requested set-back. I. Pronschinske seconded the motion, and it carried with a voice vote.

Conditional Use Permit regarding KAW Sand Mine

During the beginning of the review, I. Pronschinske stated that he would refrain from any comments. The Board proceeded to review the conditional use permit for the KAW Valley Sand Mine, making changes as necessary. Also the Town of Dodge documentation was read; nothing new added to the Town of Arcadia's permit. J. Bawek proceeded to read a written concern regarding truck traffic at the intersection of Cty. N and Hwy 95. He plans to forward this to the Trempealeau County Land Department. KAW Valley representatives indicated that they have already discussed the traffic concern with the County, and will provide the Board with the name of the person whom they spoke to. R. Tuschner commented that the DOT should give a copy of documentation to the Township when it is sent to the County. P Winey stated that there has been a mine in the past that did not follow stipulated road conditions so the Town needs to ensure that the mines follow the requirements. Neil Wozney then voiced his concern regarding set-back, berm and blasting issues; will be very close to his home. The Town Board decided to table the Conditional Use Permit until the next meeting to allow Wozney's to discuss issues with KAW Valley. The KAW representatives stated that they need the Town Board's approval on the CUP to move forward with the County. The Board felt that the decision could be reached by the next meeting.

An update on projects was presented by R. Conrad. The Town crew has been working on Mahutga Lane as well as cutting grass and brush. Conrad also has been showing the new part-time men the route and equipment. Also discussed using County sand, and pricing will be checked. Conrad will turn in sheets weekly to help with billing. Last concern was regarding Korpall Valley bridge with possible standing water. The Crew will make some changes to help with this issue.

M. Wineski made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and was seconded by I. Pronschinske. The meeting adjourned at 8:33 PM.
